



One In A Million Free School Uniform Guide

All our students in Year 7 to 11 are expected to wear the approved school uniform. A high standard of work and behaviour is expected from all our students and we believe these are helped by also having a high standard appearance. All items of school uniform are worn conventionally and we expect parents/carers to support our simple yet practical requirements. We operate uniform checks each morning to ensure our students uphold our high standards with regard to the dress code and to check on essential items for a successful school day. This includes checking our students have the correct uniform and it is worn correctly. If the correct uniform isn't being worn, students will be asked to change into school owned alternatives or they may be sent home to change.

Non uniform coats, hoodies or footwear should be removed before students enter the building and stored in their bag or locker.

Uniform Suppliers

Uniform that bears our logo is only available from the approved stockist below. The compulsory school logo badged items are the blazer, v-neck jumper and the PE Kit. This gives you the flexibility to buy any remaining items such as trousers and shirts from wherever you choose. This is to offer families the opportunity to gain best value for money; however, it must meet our standard uniform requirements.

Please note, for your convenience Embroidery In House will be holding uniform days/evenings in school where you can order, buy or try on uniform items. If you wish to contact them directly prior to this please do so.



The School Blazer - This must be worn at all times around school and in Assembly. Students may ask their teachers permission to remove their blazer once in the classroom.

V Neck Jumper - A black v-neck jumper with the school logo must be worn in addition to the school blazer. The logo is not optional and therefore a plain black jumper would not be acceptable.

Shirt - A plain white shirt, with collar should be worn and be tucked in. This needs to button to the top of the neck and should enable a velcro-fix tie to be worn. Fashion shirts/blouses are not permitted.

Tie - A tie should be worn at all times with the top button of the shirt fastened.

Trousers - Black trousers must be worn. Tight trousers, jogging bottoms, fashion trousers, combats, jeans, varieties of leggings and footless tights are not permitted.

A plain, slim black belt can be worn, but a coloured or wide belt with buckles would not be suitable.

Shoes - Plain all-black leather or leather-look school shoes, not leather trainers (e.g. Converse). The wearing of trainers of any description, ballerina style shoes, backless shoes, boots which are longer than ankle length, fabric or canvas shoes, platforms, flip-flops or high heels is not allowed. Shoes and soles must not have logos or writing on and laces must be black. No jewelled or other decorative trims will be permitted.

Make Up - Is not allowed in Years 7-9. It will only be tolerated in Years 10 and 11, if it is kept to a minimum. Students will be expected to remove makeup with a suitable cleanser if judged too excessive.

Nails - Nail extensions, false nails, shellac or nail polish in anything other than clear is not allowed in school. Nails should be kept trimmed to a reasonable length.

Hair - Extreme hairstyles such as very close shaven hair, shaved patterns or excessive lines are not permitted. Unnatural colours or extreme contrasts of colours are not allowed. Students will be sent home and asked to change it, if staff feel they are not following our hair policy correctly. Students will be required to tie hair back if requested, e.g. during practical lessons and so hair ties should be brought to school with them.

Jewellery - Jewellery is restricted to the wearing of a watch and a plain metal stud earring. Other types of ear rings such as bars, ear stretchers and hoops are not allowed. Students should not wear rings, bracelets or bangles.

Piercings - Piercings including tongue, eyebrow and nose are not permitted. Any new piercings should be made at a time when they can heal away from school time e.g. during the summer holidays.

Socks - Must be plain black.

Headscarf - If a student wishes to wear a head covering, a uniform hijab should be worn. No other headscarves are permitted for health and safety purposes.

A black PE T-shirt/polo shirt with the school logo
Black shorts with the school logo
Black hoodie/PE training top with the school logo
Black sports leggings with the school logo
Black sports socks
Trainers (any colour) (pumps are not acceptable)

Optional Items: Tracksuit bottoms with the school logo

Equality

One In A Million has considered its obligations under the Equality Act 2010 not to discriminate unlawfully on the grounds of disability, ethnicity, gender, sex or religion or sexual orientation. Racial, cultural and religious needs accommodated within the general policy are given below.

- Muslim females who choose to wear a head covering are permitted to do so, but it must be the plain black snood style available from the uniform supplier. The wearing of a Niqab is not allowed.
- Jewish males may wear a black kippah and sikhs may wear a black turban.

One In A Million respects that:

- A beard can be grown in line with religious observance.
- Rastafarians and Sikhs can grow their hair long, but this must be tied back in a safe and secure manner.
- Males and females with African-Caribbean ethnicity can wear their hair in cornrows or braids, which if long must be tied back in a safe a secure manner.

One In A Million may allow certain religious amulets to be worn discreetly by students where there is religious significance.

Unacceptable Footwear



No trainers of any description, ballerina style, backless shoes, boots that are longer than ankle length, fabric or canvas shoes, platforms, flip-flops or high heels. Shoes and soles must not have logos or writing on and laces must be black.
